In a sense, Jim serves as a substitute for Huck's father. Contrary to his natural father, Jim takes the role of the father that gives him moral courage, and seeks to love and protect him. Huck's character develops the more experience he gains which leads him to becoming aware of society's falseness until he finally rebels against it by...
