The purpose of this report is to present recommendations for future research on CPP based on the findings from that review and input from stakeholders. We describe a preliminary but reproducible process that relied upon stakeholder engagement and feedback across prespecified criteria to transform identified research gaps into prioritized research needs. CPP in women is a commonly occurring and poorly understood condition. Little consensus on the definition of the condition existsthe duration of pelvic pain considered chronic in published studies varies from 3 to more than 6 months, and the location and pathology of the pain are largely unspecified. The American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists defines chronic pelvic pain as noncyclical pain of at least 6 months duration that appears in locations such as the pelvis, anterior abdominal wall, lower back, or buttocks, and that is serious enough to cause disability or lead to medical care.
