In Samoa the word tagala means man, resident; and tagaz a fanua means (resident in the country [see dictionnaire Malais - Francais by Favre, Vienna, 1875, and dictionnaire samoan-francais-anglais by Violette, Paris, The word banwa originated through the Malay benwa from the Arabic beni, which means descendants, descent. This name of Tagbanwa they apply to themselves so as to indicate that they are the real natives of the country they inhabit. Is there any philologic relation between the Filipino taga or tega and the Mexican teco used in composition as in Tecolotlan, Tecoluca, and Tecolete, names of cities in Mexico?
