Meta-ethical attempts to define concepts such as goodness, right and wrong, ought and ought not, have proved largely futile, even over-ambitious. Morality, it is argued, should therefore be directed primarily at the reduction of suffering, principally because the latter is more easily recognisable and accords with an objective view and requirements of the human condition.
