Grose (Antiquities, ii. 61) holds it, it is true, to be a Teutonic tongue, introduced in the first age of Christianity, or perhaps earlier. But no one has ever seriously discussed so wild a theory. I have already alluded to the opinion of Vallancey, that the Forth dialect is nothing more than the English of the invaders. The anonymous report in the Southwell MSS., written in 1682, describes it as old Saxon English. Colonel Richards pronounces it the very language brought over by Fitzstephen, and adds that whoever hath read old Chaucer will better understand it than an English or Irishman.
