Having reached a conclusion in favor of the right of pelagic sealing, it became necessary, in their well-meant effort to reach a compromise between the conflicting interests, to frame such regulations as would, on the one hand, allow pelagic sealing to be carried on with profit, and, on the other hand, not seriously impair the seal herd. This insoluble problem doubtless occasioned them long and anxious deliberations and greatly delayed the final decision. The protocols show that the Tribunal was brought face to face with this problem. When Mr. Justice Harlan submitted a resolution to the effect that the purpose of Article VII of the treaty was to secure the proper protection and preservation of the seals, and that in the framing of regulations no extent of pelagic...
