Excerpt from Crops and Markets, Vol. 3: March 21, 1925 Demand for stockers and feeders was one of the outstanding features of the cattle market during the week March 9 - 14. Fed steers advanced but the trade in weighty kinds was erratic. Hogs dropped 25c - 40c at Chicago, and fat lamb values also declined. Weight and finish were the deciding factors which determined lamb-values, kinds averaging 100 - 110 pounds selling \$2 under handy weights of comparable grades. Feeding and shearing offerings sold on a parity, with finished handy-weight kinds in most instances. A sluggish fresh meat trade was reflected in generally declining prices, mutton being an exception. Butter markets weakened and prices declined during the week, March 9 - 14. This was largely due to caution on the part of buyers as statistically the position was fairly firm. Receipts and street stocks were not burdensome and storage withdrawals were fairly heavy. The total holdings in the United States as of March 1 were reported as pounds, a surplus over 1924. Of pounds. Foreign markets were slightly lower but firm...
