Machinery was re placing man labor and reducing the need for so much fat in the working man s diet. Pe0p1e were moving to the cities and adopting more sedentary occupations, with a resulting change in diet. Vegetable oils began a spectacular rise in public favor. Lard, for domestic use and export, began a long decline to the status of a low-priced product. The hog was soon producing a year s meat for two and a year s lard for three. Growers and breeders, who had watched the pendulum swing in hog types, were understandably confused as to what type of hog best satisfied the market and their own interests. Following a series of tests by various State agricultural experiment stations during the 1920 s, the U. S. Department of Agriculture and some State experiment stations did research on hog types. The Department s trials extended from 1931 through 1938. The tests, on 800 small medium and large-type hogs, sought to find the advantages and disadvantages...
