The action takes place over the course of the day after Plato's Symposium with a sexually importunate Socrates accosting Alcibiades at a beauty spa and attempting to draw him into conversation. Unbeknown to Socrates, Alcibiades begins to give voice not only to his own concerns and situation but to the philosophy of the one who aspires to be Socrates' nemesis - Friedrich Nietzsche. All this takes place against a back-drop...
