Blossom and petal are both trochees; but there is a subtle difference in the time-duration of the first foot of each. The first syllable of petal has in speech a tendency to drop from its perch a little quicker than that of blossom. That tendency the composer has put for you in black and white. He has taken the very bit out of your mouth, for you wanted to do that yourself! But because petal is a little different from blossom it doesn't follow that blossom...
