When there is in the home or community an agricultural industry whose activities run more or less throughout the year, like dairying, fruit-growing, poultry-keeping, etc., such industry should be made the backbone of the course. 5. All laboratory work should demonstrate some point or topic under consideration in class. These exercises should exemplify the practical rather than the theoretical points at issue, and the results should be interpreted in terms of home and farm application rather than in terms of pure science. 6. Students manifesting a great deal of interest in agriculture should be encouraged to apply their knowledge at home. That phase of agriculture most attractive to them should be organized into a definite project to be worked out at home under the supervision of the school. The Boys and Girls Club movement provides the means and methods for such study and supervision. 7. All of the other school subjects may be vitalized and greatly...



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
