This isn't just a story based around grand buildings, it's about the ordinary people of the city as well. These people, with their indomitable spirit, have made Liverpool great and will make it great again. Liverpool began as a sub-manor attached to the Manor of West Derby and did not rate a mention in the Domesday Book. The town developed slowly. At the time of the Restoration there were only seven main streets and the first regular coach service between Liverpool and London only started in 1760. It was the development of the dock system that changed the character of Liverpool. In 1709, the nation's first purpose-built dock was opened and expansion soon followed as trade developed and in 1824, Jesse Hartley was appointed as Dock Engineer. His achievements were prodigious and during the next thirty-six years he created more than 140 acres of wet docks including the Alber Dock, which, opened in 1845, was arguably his greatest feat.
