The author doesn t just provide a careful retelling of the graduates experiences, she also delves into the history of Worcester, Massachusetts, and how the school s buildings that its alumni hold so dear have since been repurposed. As a distinctive and proud Franco-American Catholic boarding school, Assumption High offered its pupils an education that was rigorous, religious, and designed to preserve the French-Canadian language and culture that its students and their families cherished.
