Readers will learn what needlework meant to ladies, for whom it was a hobby reflecting refinement and femininity, and discover what such skills could mean as a suitable way for a woman to make a living, often through grueling labor. Such insights are illustrated throughout with examples from womens periodicals, needlework guides, pattern books, and personal memoirs that bring the period to life for the modern reader.
