Thorax black, subshining, mesonotum and scutellum thickly brownish yellow pilose, pleurae sparsely so, scutellum without spines, halteres yellow. Abdomen black, subshining, yellowish pilose, the third segment except largely on posterior angles, the fourth except narrow posterior border, and venter of latter, black pilose. Legs black, sparsely yellow pilose, hind metatarsi slightly incrassate, about as long as the following joints together, all pulvilli yellowish. Wings hyaline, veins black, indistinctly infuscated. Length, 12 mm. One specimen, Englewood, Clark county, Kansas. Collected during June, 1903, by Dr. F. H. Snow. *Limosina atra*, n. sp. Female. Black throughout; antennae correct, third...
