

Is not the melancholy fate of Beatrice impressed upon us more forcibly by that sad, reproachful glance portrayed by Guido, than by the tragedy of Shelley Books give us a far-off, unreal notion of things, a feeling of an action happening in another land and at another time; while a picture or a statue brings it into our actual presence, and gives us a congenial and fraternal sympathy with its characters. We see that they are of like form and feature with ourselves, and were surely possessed of a like nature. Aided by the brush or chisel, we enter more readily into their joys and sufferings. M. s. T.
