When solution of ammonia is poured upon calomel, protoxide of mercury, and muriate of ammonia, are the results; but ammonia, added to a solution of corrosive sublimate, occasions a white precipitate of a triple muriate of ammonia and mercury. A compound of this kind has long been used in pharmacy, under the name of calx hydrargyri alba, or white precipitate. The London Pharmacopoeia directs the following process for its formation. Take of oxymuriate mercury J lb. muriate of ammonia 4 oz. solution of subcarbonate of potassa pint. distilled water 4-pints. First dissolve the muriate of ammonia, then the oxymuriate of...
