In these cases, State would revoke the persons visa under the Secretary of States discretionary authority, requiring the person to reapply for a visa if he or she still intended to visit the United States. State would then use the visa issuance process to obtain additional biographic and other data on the visa applicant and make a determination on the persons eligibility. INS officials viewed the process as a means of notifying INS inspectors to deny suspected terrorists entry into the United States. These officials did not view a visa revocation, even if based on terrorism concerns, as a reason for investigating someone who had already entered the United States. They said the INA does not specify visa revocation as a reason for removing a person from the country. (App. II provides more information on legal issues associated with visa revocations.)
